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Foreword by the Executive Director



As we enter the second full year of implementation of [CEPOL's strategy 2023-2027](#), I am pleased to introduce to you our Training Catalogue 2024, which encompasses our current training offer for the EU law enforcement community.

Before I go into more details about our latest training updates, I would like to share with you some thoughts about how I envisage our agency's role in the ever-evolving and complex EU security landscape.

Unexpected developments continued to have a significant impact on our lives. The war in Ukraine has entered its third year, while the situation in the Middle East has taken several dramatic turns. Conflict in different regions creates a window of opportunity for criminals. At the same time, technological advancements allow criminal networks to operate beyond borders, adapt and embrace novel and efficient modus operandi. Let us not forget the role of AI and the rapidly evolving machine learning techniques which could become dangerous in the wrong hands.

In order to keep Europe and its neighbourhood safe, law enforcement officials need to adapt to new emerging threats that know no borders, and provide a fast response to evolving criminal methods, be it in the real world or in cyberspace. This is where training has a significant role to play; training specifically tailored to address particular knowledge gaps, requiring an evolving set of skills and competences. Most importantly, training at EU level that encourages the development of robust professional networks in the Union and beyond, fostering effective cooperation that brings immediate results. This is what CEPOL has to offer within the EU security ecosystem.

Every decision taken, every new development at CEPOL has one core aim: To constantly improve and enrich the agency's training portfolio with the most advanced learning methods, to elaborate on the most pertinent topics, so that law enforcement officials can stay ahead of crime, keeping the EU and its neighbourhood safe. Whilst we grow into the **EU hub for law enforcement training**, we will continue to embrace more agile and flexible working methods enabling a fast response to emerging crime patterns and threats and ensuring the delivery of training at its best.

LEEd, our Law Enforcement Education platform, is the gateway to CEPOL's training activities. We constantly introduce updates and new features, with the aim to improve usability and cover a larger number and variety of learning opportunities. LEEd is where your journey with CEPOL begins. If you are not yet registered, I encourage you to apply for an account and start training with us.

This year, for the first time, CEPOL launched a call to receive proposals for **training activities addressing emerging needs**. Via this initiative, we will be able to offer up to three activities on high priority ad hoc training needs. In addition, for the first time we will organise the **EU Law Enforcement Challenge**, a team exercise where participants will need to solve a complex and realistic case scenario on ransomware investigations, reflecting the complexities of cross-border investigations and relevant cyber threats. I am really looking forward to congratulating the winning team!

The findings of the [CEPOL EU Strategic Training Needs Assessment \(EU-STNA\) 2022-2025](#), and the outcomes of operational level training needs analyses, in line with the priorities set by the [European Multidisciplinary Platform Against Criminal Treats \(EMPACT\)](#), are reflected in our training portfolio. The new EU Roadmap of priority measures to fight organised crime and drug trafficking reminds us of the importance of training for law enforcement officials working at the frontline to keep us safe. In 2024, more than 80 CEPOL activities are dedicated to different **EMPACT priorities**. In June, we will organise one of our flagship events, the **EMPACT 2022+ drivers' workshop**. It will bring together Drivers and Co-Drivers, with the aim to support them in their role and promote EMPACT as a key EU instrument in the fight against serious and organised crime. Another EMPACT product that we are proud of is our **series of eLessons on illicit drugs laboratories**. They offer registered LEEd users virtual tours of various illicit drug production facilities. The facilities can be explored by taking the

tour and studying the interactive hotspots, including photos, explanatory texts and videos. They are accessible from any computer or mobile device and by using virtual reality goggles.

As highlighted in our agency's strategy, CEPOL aspires to foster a common EU law enforcement culture via training, a culture with the **protection and respect of fundamental rights** at its core. The EU-STNA corroborates this approach, identifying fundamental rights and data protection as a top core capability gap for law enforcement to be addressed via training. This year we will continue to integrate the protection of fundamental rights as a horizontal topic in our training offer. In our catalogue you will find a section presenting learning activities for law enforcement officials specifically designed to address practical and topical aspects of safeguarding fundamental rights.

With regards to the **research and scientific knowledge** domain, I am proud to announce that this autumn the CEPOL European Research and Science Conference 2024 will be exploring the results of the fight against high-risk criminal networks. With this activity, we aim to facilitate scientific conversations by looking at trends, challenges, leading practices, and opportunities to disrupt and dismantle high-risk criminal networks, as an EMPACT priority, and contribute to the concerted operational response of the EU.

Following last year's successful practice, we plan to continue applying a **blended learning approach**. Blended learning is a multi-step programme combining various forms of training that complement each other, both online and onsite. Learners can gain a more holistic and in-depth understanding of a specific topic, with an emphasis on practical and applicable skills. I would like to highlight a selection of five topical training activities in 2024 where CEPOL will offer this learning programme approach: THB – sexual exploitation, illicit drug laboratory dismantling (advanced), combatting drug production crimes, digital forensic investigator training, and intellectual property rights - counterfeiting and piracy.

In the meantime, our two [CEPOL Knowledge Centres](#) will be steadily working towards the delivery of a variety of specialised onsite and online training activities. **CEPOL Knowledge Centres** are hubs for knowledge transfer and peer-learning addressed to practitioners working in a particular field or crime area, addressing the current needs of law enforcement officials across the EU. Their experts contribute to both the design and the implementation of CEPOL training programmes in two important areas: [Counter-terrorism](#) and [Law Enforcement Cooperation, Information Exchange and Interoperability](#).

Enhancing the training and capacity-building effectiveness of our partners is equally crucial. After last year's positive results, we will organise our second **workshop for heads of law enforcement training institutes**, with the aim to exchange ideas on the development of training programmes, accreditation and evaluation, discuss the best practices within the different mobility schemes funded by EU, and highlight how the EU-STNA can support the work of training institutes.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my **gratitude towards our external partners**, for their continuous support and cooperation. Needless to say that the successful delivery of numerous activities mentioned in this publication relies on their contributions. A special thank you goes to our CEPOL National Units and National Contact Points for their enthusiasm and dedication!

I now invite you to browse the **CEPOL Training Catalogue 2024**, for an overview of the numerous training opportunities that our agency has to offer to EU law enforcement officials. I hope that within this publication you will find activities that can help broaden your knowledge and skills and support you in your daily work. My colleagues and I look forward to welcoming you to any of the training activities we have planned for you!

A portfolio suited to a wide range of learning styles and needs

The **European Union Agency for Law Enforcement Training (CEPOL)** facilitates the prevention and fight against serious and organised crime, terrorism and emerging security threats by facilitating and enhancing cross-border cooperation through vocational training. Our mission is making Europe a safer place through law enforcement training and learning.

CEPOL has been working with national training institutes in the EU for more than two decades using learning as a lever to further strengthen law enforcement cooperation.

Our training and learning activities encourage the development of competencies that are vital for the internal security of the European Union, promote the exchange of knowledge and experiences, and support the development of long-lasting professional networks.

We provide opportunities to stay up-to-date with the latest developments and trends in the law enforcement field, especially concerning cross-border and serious and organised crime. At CEPOL, we constantly strive to offer innovative and advanced training activities by integrating relevant developments in knowledge, research and technology, and by creating synergies through strengthened cooperation.

At CEPOL we apply a multi-layered approach to learning, we offer different types of training activities and online learning resources complementing one another:

Onsite training activities are physical gatherings of participants and trainers for a certain number of days for the purpose of transferring knowledge, expertise and skills between trainers and participants, facilitated by the organiser, who is represented by the activity manager. These activities provide an opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of a subject. Teaching often features case studies and participants are encouraged to share best practices. Our onsite training activities take mainly the form of onsite courses.

- **Courses** – Onsite courses are training activities designed for a deep understanding of a topic. They include a specified number of lessons, practical exercises, study visits, discussions, group work and assignments. They last between two and five days, depending on the onsite course. CEPOL onsite courses take place in training institutes across the EU or at our headquarters.

If you have a particular interest in participating in one of our onsite courses, please contact your CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point and submit your expression of interest. The period for nomination usually opens at least one month before the start of the training activity.

Please note that the submission of an expression of interest does not guarantee a formal nomination. Participation is only possible following an official appointment by the CEPOL National Unit or the National Contact Point.

Online learning activities or e-Learning is a type of computer-based distance learning. It is a good way to learn at your own pace and in your own time. Our e-Learning activities take the form of webinars, online modules, online courses, e-workshops, eLessons, cyber-bites and a virtual training centre on intellectual property rights.

- **Webinars** – Webinars are short interactive online seminars to raise awareness about a specific topic, identify new trends or demonstrate how to use a tool. Accessible any time in a recorded version through LEEed, their estimated duration is 90 minutes.

** Generally, LEEd users can enrol to webinars free of charge, without nomination by a CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point.*

- **Online modules** – Online modules are extended knowledge resources on specific topics that can be used by individuals for self-paced learning or by trainers and teachers who blend them in their courses or other formal training activities – both within a CEPOL context and in national curricula. The estimated duration of an online module is between three to six hours. Those who complete an online module successfully will receive a certificate and badge.

** Generally, LEEd users can enrol to online modules free of charge, without nomination by a CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point.*

- **Online courses** – Online courses offer a flexibility and convenience that onsite courses cannot match. A limited number of participants are guided virtually by trainers as they build their knowledge of key law enforcement capabilities. The delivery format supports self-paced learning, however, often presentations are provided by scheduled live sessions where acknowledged experts are presenting. The courses also support peer and group activities and group discussions. Online courses usually last between two and four weeks.

** If you have an interest in participating in one of our upcoming online courses, please contact your CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point to express your interest. All applicants must be registered users in LEEd.*

- **e-Workshops** – e-Workshops are virtual classroom activities with a small group of trainees. They are dedicated to specific and highly relevant subjects, which facilitates in-depth exploration of issues that are of topical interest. An e-Workshop usually lasts three days, each training day requiring between three and four hours of study.

** If you have an interest in participating in one of our upcoming e-Workshops, please contact your CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point to express your interest. All applicants must be registered users in LEEd.*

- **eLessons** – CEPOL's eLessons are training resources, similar to the online modules in that they can be used by individuals as self-paced learners as well as by trainers and teachers who need to embed a knowledge resource in their courses or other formal training activities – either within a CEPOL or on a national context. The content is more specialised, interactive and explorative than the modules and the study time is limited to 60 minutes. In addition, each eLesson offers a job-aid which assists users to transfer the lessons they have learned into their professional daily practice.

** Generally, LEEd users can enrol to eLessons free of charge, without nomination by a CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point.*

- **Cyber-bites** – Cyber-bites are a sequence of individual webinars all connected by the same overall topic. This micro learning resource helps law enforcement officials to keep pace with the latest technological developments on cyber-crime, cyber-enabled crimes, and related trends. The average duration of a cyber-bite is 20-30 minutes.

** Generally, LEEd users can enrol to cyber-bites free of charge, without nomination by a CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point.*

- **The Virtual Training Centre (VTC) on Intellectual Property (IP) rights** – The VTC on IP right is a joint endeavour between CEPOL and the EU Intellectual Property Office (EUIPO), supported by the European Commission Directorate-General for Taxation that offers learning and training resources on intellectual property rights and infringements. This virtual space contains a repository of training resources that trainers can use in their formal training activities in this field or individual learners can use to learn at

their own pace. For some of the VTC resources, CEPOL and EUIPO offer a certificate of completion to users who successfully complete the units. The VTC on IP rights is addressed to law enforcement and the judiciary, with a focus on police and customs.

LEEd users can access the VTC free of charge without nomination by a CEPOL National Unit/CEPOL National Contact Point.

The admission process to our e-Learning activities varies based on the type of training activity selected. All our e-Learning activities are supported by LEEd.



Blended learning

To ensure a comprehensive training approach in a selection of serious crime areas, CEPOL offers modular learning programmes. These programmes include various complementary products: online modules and/or webinars (to acquire basic awareness), online courses (to acquire detailed knowledge) and onsite courses (for networking and knowledge sharing).

As part of our learning portfolio, we offer law enforcement officials the possibility to participate in an exchange programme. **CEPOL Exchange Programme** aspires to build long-term knowledge and confidence between police forces and other law enforcement bodies in the EU.

Under this scheme, officials involved in operational cross-border cooperation are hosted by law enforcement institutions from another country, giving participants the chance to share good practices, exchange insights, build trust, initiate cooperation projects and foster deep and long-lasting networking opportunities. The study period abroad can last up to one week.

About LEEd, CEPOL's Law Enforcement Education platform



LEEd serves as a gateway to CEPOL's training activities.

Law enforcement officials who want to have access to our training offer, whether onsite or online, must be registered users in LEEd. If you are not a registered user in LEEd, follow the steps on how to create an account and get started.

In addition to CEPOL's training offer, the platform grants users full access to research and science resources in the form of a repository of documents with browsing and filter capabilities by categories. LEEd also includes a forum for users to communicate amongst themselves, a connection with the EBSCO Discovery Service to consult e-books and e-journals, and a space for conference management.

Learning with CEPOL never stops. LEEd is available in a user-friendly mobile interface to make distance learning more flexible, accessible and easier for law enforcement officials pursuing training activities. Users can download learning resources in the form of webinars, courses, and modules for offline viewing, or they can send messages and track their learning progress 'on the go'. LEEd app runs on iOS and Android and is available on *AppStore* and *Google Play*.

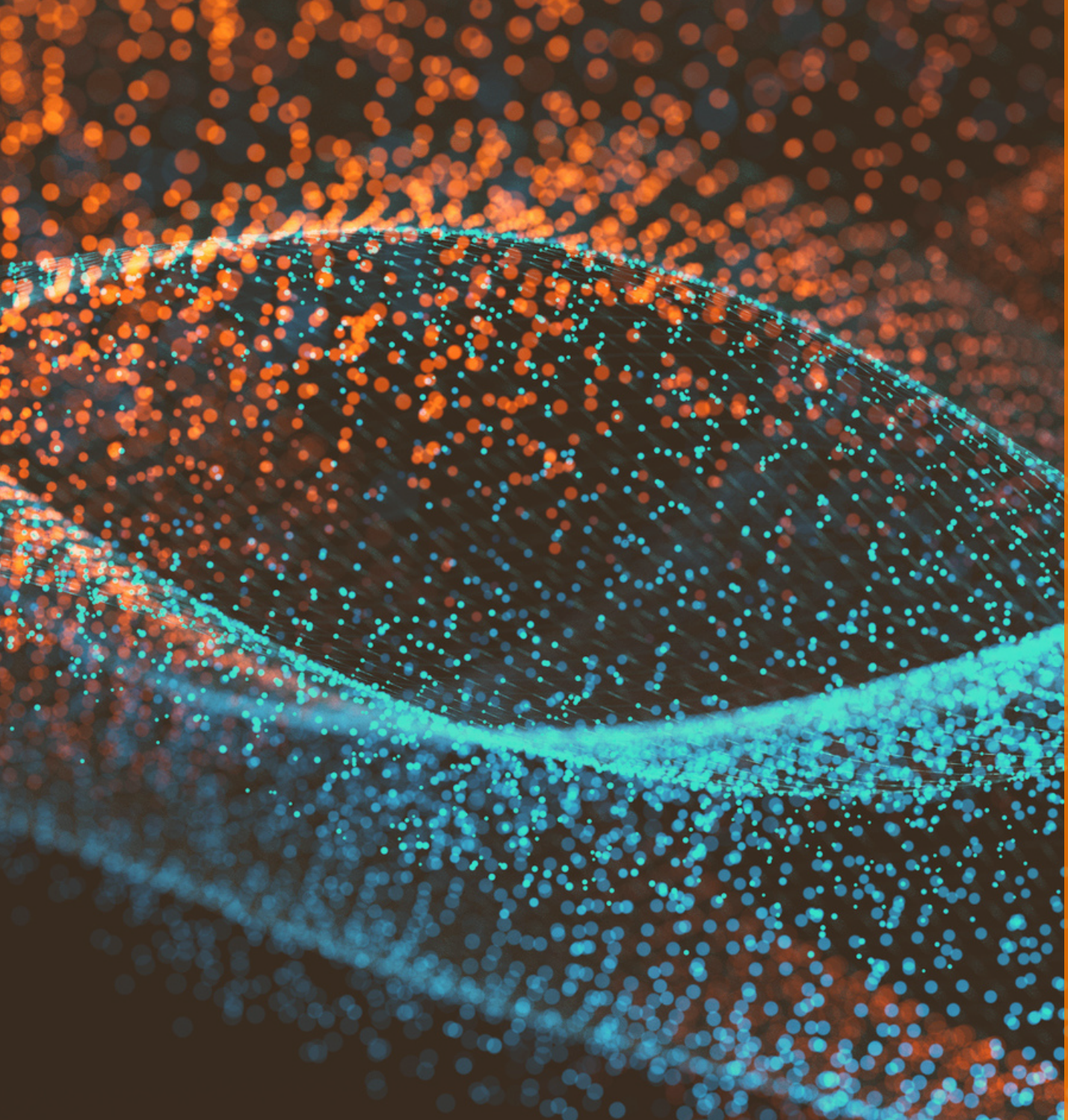
