CEPOL's mission is making Europe a safer place through law enforcement training and learning. Therefore, I am pleased to share with you our Training Catalogue, presenting a full overview of our planned onsite and online training activities for 2025.

At the beginning of this year, as we moved to our new modern premises in Budapest, we resumed our work with renewed energy and enthusiasm. I am proud to say that in our current facilities we can offer the EU law enforcement community upscaled training opportunities that can flexibly respond to the emerging training needs identified in our ever-evolving security landscape.

Our aim is to equip you with the latest knowledge, methods, and tools to help you in your daily work of keeping the EU and its citizens safe. CEPOL implements an evidence-based portfolio in which training activities are in line with the EU Strategic Training Needs Assessment (EU-STNA) and the training needs identified through thematic Operational Training Needs Analyses, within the scope of the current European Multidisciplinary Platform Against Criminal Threats (EMPACT) cycle. In 2025 more than 70 CEPOL activities are dedicated to different EMPACT priorities.

As every year, in June we will organise one of our flagship events, the EMPACT 2022+ drivers' workshop. We will bring together Drivers, Co-Drivers and Coordinators of common horizontal strategic goals. In November, national EMPACT coordinators will join us in Budapest for a 2-day workshop. Our aim is to support them in their role within EMPACT 2022+ and promote EMPACT as a key EU instrument in the fight against serious and organised crime.

To help law enforcement officials stay ahead of crime even when it comes to the newest crime trends, our training portfolio is agile. This year for the second time we launched a call to receive proposals for training activities addressing emerging needs. Via this initiative, we will be delivering three additional onsite courses: Hybrid Threats, Maximise the Use of AI tools-Europol Tool Repository, and Pan-European Football Security.

While implementing this year's work programme, we are also preparing our training portfolios for the upcoming years with the launch of the EU-STNA 2026-2029 and operational analyses of training needs in the areas of Artificial Intelligence, Child sexual exploitation and Law enforcement cooperation, information exchange and interoperability.

Our CEPOL Knowledge Centres (CKC) will deliver more than 30 specialised training activities. They are hubs for knowledge transfer and peer-learning addressed to practitioners working in a particular field or crime area. Their experts contribute to both the design and the implementation of CEPOL training programmes in two important areas: Counter-terrorism and Law Enforcement Cooperation, Information Exchange and Interoperability. CKCs support the Training Needs Analysis and help ensure the quality of the implemented activities.

LEEd, our Law Enforcement Education platform is where your journey with us starts, so if you do not have an account yet, please submit your application as soon as possible. Relunched in February, following last year's cyber incident, the platform has been rebuilt and upgraded to a newer version, ensuring improved performance and security. For safety purposes, all passwords were reset, while a Multi-Factor Authentication is now obligatory for all users. We will continue to introduce updates and new features in LEEd, making it more user friendly and tailored to cover a variety of learning opportunities.

Allow me to highlight some concepts which are becoming an important element of our training offer and help enhance the overall impact of our activities. At CEPOL we believe that when it comes to law enforcement training design and implementation in key crime areas, multi-format, multi-modular learning programmes are the way forward. Such programmes include a variety of training methods, complementing each other, and representing building blocks in strengthening your understanding and skills in a particular area: online modules and webinars (basic awareness), online courses (detailed knowledge) and onsite courses (consolidating knowledge and creating networks of professionals beyond borders), exchanges/mentoring/study visits (personalised learning). This approach is what we call 'blended learning'. Our blended learning philosophy is always present when we design our training activities.

Our THB-sexual exploitation training was our first blended-learning activity in 2023, and it has already become a flagship formal learning programme among practitioners. This year, in addition to this, we are organising two more activities in the same format: "Intellectual Property Rights – Counterfeiting and Piracy" and "Digital Forensic Investigator Training".

An important element that strengthens and complements the blended learning model is 'cascading'. While we can only train a limited number of law enforcement officials every year, we rely on them to become our 'ambassadors' back home, as they can share the knowledge gained with their team at national level. That's where our Train-the-Trainer activities play a key role, as they prepare law enforcement officials specialised in training to cascade their knowledge and help maximise its impact.

The successful delivery of numerous activities mentioned in this publication relies on the continuous support of our network. Thus, I would like to express my gratitude towards our partners and all the members of the CEPOL family for their work and cooperation. A special thank you goes to our CEPOL National Units and National Contact Points for their enthusiasm and dedication!

I hope that within this publication you will find training opportunities offering you knowledge and skills you can apply in your daily work. My colleagues and I look forward to welcoming you to one of our upcoming activities.

A portfolio suited to a wide range of learning styles and needs

The **European Union Agency for Law Enforcement Training (CEPOL)** facilitates the prevention and fight against serious and organised crime, terrorism and emerging security threats by facilitating and enhancing cross-border law enforcement cooperation through vocational training. Our mission is making Europe a safer place through law enforcement training and learning.

CEPOL has been working with national training institutes in the EU for more than two decades using learning as a lever to further strengthen law enforcement cooperation.

Our training and learning activities encourage the development of competencies that are vital for the internal security of the European Union, promote the exchange of knowledge and experiences, and support the development of long-lasting professional networks.

We provide opportunities to stay up to date with the latest developments and trends in the law enforcement field, especially concerning cross-border and serious and organised crime. At CEPOL, we constantly strive to offer innovative and advanced training activities by integrating relevant developments in knowledge, research, and technology, and by creating synergies through strengthened cooperation.

At CEPOL we apply a multi-layered approach to learning, we offer different types of training activities and online learning resources complementing one another:

Onsite training activities are physical gatherings of participants and trainers for a certain number of days for the purpose of transferring knowledge, expertise and skills between trainers and participants, facilitated by the organiser, who is represented by the activity manager. These activities provide an opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of a subject. Teaching often features case studies and participants are encouraged to share best practices. Our onsite training activities take mainly the form of onsite courses.

- **Courses** – Onsite courses are training activities designed for a deep understanding of a topic. They include a specified number of lessons, practical exercises, study visits, discussions, group work and assignments. They last between two and five days, depending on the onsite course. CEPOL onsite courses take place in training institutes across the EU or at our headquarters.

If you have a particular interest in participating in one of our onsite courses, please contact your CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point and submit your expression of interest. The period for nomination usually opens at least one month before the start of the training activity.

Please note that the submission of an expression of interest does not guarantee a formal nomination. Participation is only possible following an official appointment by the CEPOL National Unit or the National Contact Point.

Online learning activities or e-Learning is a type of computer-based distance learning. It is a good way to learn at your own pace and in your own time. Our e-Learning activities take the form of webinars (live and recorded), online modules, online courses, e-workshops, eLessons, cyber-bites and a virtual training centre on intellectual property rights.

- **Webinars** – Webinars are short interactive online seminars to raise awareness about a specific topic, identify new trends or demonstrate how to use a tool. Accessible any time in a recorded version through LEEed, their estimated duration is 90 minutes.

** Generally, LEEed users can enrol to webinars free of charge, without nomination by a CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point.*

- **Online modules** – Online modules are extended knowledge resources on specific topics that can be used by individuals for self-paced learning or by trainers and teachers who blend them in their courses or other formal training activities – both within a CEPOL context and in national curricula. The estimated duration of an online module is between three to six hours. Those who complete an online module successfully will receive a certificate and badge.

** Generally, LEEed users can enrol to online modules free of charge, without nomination by a CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point.*

- **Online courses** – Online courses offer a flexibility and convenience that onsite courses cannot match. A limited number of participants are guided virtually by trainers as they build their knowledge of key law enforcement capabilities. The delivery format supports self-paced learning, however, often presentations are provided by scheduled live sessions where acknowledged experts are presenting. The courses also support peer and group activities and group discussions. Online courses usually last between two and four weeks.

** If you have an interest in participating in one of our upcoming online courses, please contact your CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point to express your interest. All applicants must be registered users in LEEed.*

- **e-Workshops** – e-Workshops are virtual classroom activities with a small group of trainees. They are dedicated to specific and highly relevant subjects, facilitating in-depth exploration of issues that are of topical interest. An e-Workshop usually lasts three days, each training day requiring between three and four hours of study.

** If you have an interest in participating in one of our upcoming e-Workshops, please contact your CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point to express your interest. All applicants must be registered users in LEEed.*

- **eLessons** – CEPOL's eLessons are training resources, similar to the online modules in that they can be used by individuals as self-paced learners, as well as by trainers and teachers who need to embed a knowledge resource in their courses or other formal training activities – either within a CEPOL or national context. The content is more specialised, interactive, and explorative than the modules and the study time is limited to 60 minutes. In addition, each eLesson offers a job-aid which assists users to transfer the lessons they have learned into their professional daily practice.

** Generally, LEEed users can enrol to eLessons free of charge, without nomination by a CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point.*

- **Cyber-bites** – Cyber-bites are a sequence of individual webinars all connected by the same overall topic. This micro learning resource helps law enforcement officials to keep pace with the latest technological developments on cyber-crime, cyber-enabled crimes, and related trends. The average duration of a cyber-bite is 20-30 minutes.

** Generally, LEEed users can enrol to cyber-bites free of charge, without nomination by a CEPOL National Unit or National Contact Point.*

The admission process to our e-Learning activities varies based on the type of training activity selected. All our e-Learning activities are supported by LEEed.



Blended learning

To ensure a comprehensive training approach in a selection of serious crime areas, CEPOL offers modular learning programmes. These programmes include various complementary products: online modules and/or webinars (to acquire basic awareness), online courses (to acquire detailed knowledge) and onsite courses (for networking and knowledge sharing).

As part of our learning portfolio, we offer law enforcement officials the possibility to participate in an exchange programme. The **CEPOL Exchange Programme** aspires to build long-term knowledge and confidence between police forces and other law enforcement bodies in the EU.

Under this scheme, officials involved in operational cross-border cooperation are hosted by law enforcement institutions from another country, giving participants the chance to share good practices, exchange insights, build trust, initiate cooperation projects and foster deep and long-lasting networking opportunities. The study period abroad can last up to one week.

LEEd, CEPOL's Law Enforcement Education platform offers a comprehensive and customised learning environment that supports both training activities and digitalised training processes.

Law enforcement officials who would like to have access to our training offer, whether onsite or online, must be registered users in LEEd. If you are not a registered user in LEEd, follow the steps on how to create an account and get started.

In addition to CEPOL's training offer, the platform grants users' full access to research and science resources through the EBSCO Discovery Service (e-books and e-journals) with browsing and filter capabilities by categories.

Learning with CEPOL never stops. LEEd is available in a user-friendly mobile interface to make distance learning more flexible, accessible, and easier for law enforcement officials pursuing training activities. 
