

## Working together for a safer, fairer and more resilient Europe

The EU Justice and Home Affairs Agencies' Network (JHAAN) was established in 2010 to connect agencies implementing EU policies in the areas of freedom, security and justice. Together, the JHA agencies contribute to the implementation of EU objectives in the fields of migration, asylum and external border management, the fight against organised crime, drug trafficking, terrorism, gender equality and respect for fundamental rights.

Their work also includes facilitating law-enforcement training and the functioning of relevant EU IT systems.

The network is composed of nine agencies: CEPOL | EIGE | EUAA | EUDA | EU-LISA | EUROJUST | EUROPOL | FRA | FRONTEX

The European Union Drugs Agency (EUDA) chairs the network in 2026.

### Key meetings in 2026

JHAAN activities in 2026 include a series of thematic meetings addressing topics from technology foresight and drug market-related violence, to AI in security and cross-sector responses to synthetic drugs.

The presidency programme also features high-level presentations to EU institutions, coordination meetings and expert working groups.

A staff visit programme will run during the year, focusing on cross-organisational learning and collaboration.

### One Safety — building preparedness and resilient communities

The theme of the 2026 presidency is 'One Safety — building preparedness and resilient communities', which reflects the interconnected nature of today's security challenges and builds on the complementary expertise of the JHAAN agencies. The concept extends the scope of security issues to encompass multiple domains that affect the safety and well-being of citizens and communities in the EU. It brings together key areas such as law enforcement, public health, cybersecurity, climate action and crisis response.

The One Safety theme aligns with the 2025–2027 JHAAN priorities which focus on the use of digitalisation, innovation and artificial intelligence and on contributing to the European Internal Security Strategy (ProtectEU).
