

Decision of the Management Board 33/2021/MB

AMENDING AND REPLACING DECISION OF THE MANAGEMENT BOARD 28/2021/MB ESTABLISHING A REPORTING PANEL FOR PREPARING THE OBSERVATIONS TO THE FIVE-YEAR CEPOL EVALUATION REPORT

Adopted by the Management Board on 21 December 2021

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Effective from 21 December 2021

THE MANAGEMENT BOARD,

Having regard to the European Parliament and Council Regulation (EU) No 2015/22191 of 25 November 2015 on the European Union Agency for Law Enforcement Training (hereinafter 'CEPOL') and replacing and repealing Council Decision 2005/681/JHA;

Having regard to the Decision of the Management Board 28/2021/MB on establishing a reporting panel for preparing the observations to the five-year CEPOL evaluation report,

Whereas:

- (1) Article 32 'Evaluation and review' stipulates that: 'By 1 July 2021 and every five years thereafter, the Commission shall ensure that an evaluation assessing, in particular, the impact, effectiveness and efficiency of CEPOL and of its working practices is carried out. The Commission shall submit the evaluation report to the Management Board. The Management Board shall provide its observations on the evaluation report within one month from the date of receipt. The Commission shall then submit the final evaluation report, together with the Commission's conclusions, and the Management Board's observations in an Annex thereto, to the European Parliament, the Council and the Management Board. The findings of that evaluation report shall be made public'.
- (2) In order to support the Management Board to provide its observations on the evaluation report, it is necessary to establish a reporting panel.
- (3) The Executive Director of CEPOL was mandated by the Chair of the Management Board to issue a call for nomination of experts addressed to all Member States. The nomination shall include Curriculum Vitae of the proposed expert, preferably in the Euro-pass format.
- (4) Based on the nominations made by the Member States, the Management Board shall appoint the members of the reporting panel.
- (5) During the MB meeting, the MB in a simple voting procedure has voted on the members.
- (6) During the MB meeting, it became clear that the period of operation of the reporting panel needs to be updated in line with latest information from the Commission regarding availability date of the 5 years evaluation report.
- (7) Additionally, the mandate of the panel needs to be amended to accommodate the possibility of physical meetings, should that be necessary.

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HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1

The following provisions shall be amended as following:

- (1) The Reporting Panel for preparing the observations to the five-year CEPOL evaluation report is hereby established. Its tasks and remit are detailed in the amended Annex.
- (2) The Reporting Panel tentative period of operation shall be between February-March 2022. CEPOL will offer administrative support for their work

Article 2

The following provisions remain valid:

- (1) The Executive Director of CEPOL shall be part of the Reporting Panel, along with the appointed members.
- (2) The following candidates shall be appointed as members of the Reporting Panel:

- Ms Celine Grassegger
- Ms Dina Tarane
- Mr João Miguel De Almeida Madaleno

This Decision shall take effect on the day following that of its adoption.
