In recent years, Europe has faced and needs to be better prepared for more complex internal security challenges and non-conventional or hybrid forms of threats. Adequate training based on the needs of the Member States is crucial in fighting severe forms of crimes and quickly emerging new types of threats. CEPOL's mission is to contribute to making Europe a safer place through high-quality law enforcement training and by using the latest teaching methods and techniques.

We bring together a network of training institutes for law enforcement officials in the EU Member States and support them in frontline training on security priorities, law enforcement cooperation, and information exchange. We ensure that urgent, emerging training needs are addressed flexibly and promptly.

CEPOL is committed to providing a learning experience of the highest quality in all CEPOL courses, seminars, conferences, and exchange programmes. The quality of training remains a cornerstone of our activities, and I am proud to share with you that every year thousands of participants give highest satisfaction rates to CEPOL's services and thus confirm the highest standards of our offer.

This year, the Agency will continue to support all key priority areas deriving from the European Agendas on Security and Migration in line with the Law Enforcement Training Scheme principles. We plan to address with our training activities in particular areas of serious and organised international crime (including cybercrime, cyber-enabled crime, and migrant smuggling), counterterrorism and information exchange or embedding fundamental rights and crime prevention. It is of vital importance that the law enforcement community in its entirety can operate effectively in the international environment.

In choosing the right training topics and addressing them in a long-term, strategic way, we use the guidance of the recently concluded EU Strategic Training Needs Assessment 2018-2021 (EU-STNA). This scientific, evidence-based research we conducted supports us and other decision-makers in the development of law enforcement training policy for the upcoming years. In 2019 alone, we expect to implement 100 residential activities, 91 webinars and online courses, and we aim to introduce six new online modules.

This year the two (pilot) CEPOL Knowledge Centres (CKCs) are in their second year of operation. They play an essential role in building relevant training solutions in thematic areas to respond to

identified and prioritised training needs. We will further evaluate the CKC operation and present outcomes to the CEPOL Management Board for a decision on its future.

We also planned 330 exchanges of Law Enforcement officials for this year to take place across Europe and its neighbourhood and 28 students of the second edition of CEPOL's European Joint Master Programme (EJMP) are expected to graduate.

Furthermore, we aim to acquire further ISO certification for providing learning services outside formal education in accordance with ISO 29993:2017 standard. Obtaining additional ISO certifications will give our training activities further international recognition, and it will motivate us to continue to stay ahead of crime and make Europe safer, together.

Our goal is to educate more than 30 000 EU officers, to innovate learning methods and techniques, and motivate you to join one of our residential or online training activities this year.

THE CEPOL LEARNING EXPERIENCE

The European Union Agency for Law Enforcement Training has been working with national training institutes in the EU for over a decade, using learning as a lever to further strengthen law enforcement cooperation. CEPOL training and learning activities encourage the development of competencies vital for the internal security of the Union, promote the exchange of knowledge and experiences and support the development of long-lasting professional networks. CEPOL activities provide opportunities to stay up-to-date with the latest European and international developments and trends in the law enforcement field, especially concerning cross-border and serious international crime.

CEPOL employs a multi-layered approach to learning, with different activities complementing one another:

- · Residential courses and seminars;
- Online seminars (webinars);
- Online courses;
- E-learning modules;
- · Bilateral exchanges through CEPOL Exchange Programme;
- Common curricula.

Residential activities are courses, conferences, and seminars that typically last a week and are held in training institutes of the Member States or at CEPOL headquarters. Residential activities provide an opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of a specific subject. Teaching often features case studies and participants are encouraged to share best practices.

To complement its residential activities, CEPOL offers several online learning tools. Online learning is an efficient way to learn at your own pace and in your own time. You can choose from around 100 webinars, online modules, and online courses and you can also join our communities of practice. To take part in online learning, you must be a registered e-Net user. The e-Net, CEPOL's online learning platform is open to all EU law enforcement officers and is free to use. Via the e-Net, users have access to tools and resources that support and prolong the learning experience. The e-Net platform also hosts the e-Library, which allows the archiving, sharing, and disseminating of any knowledge documents or scientific findings related to policing and its context in the European arena. The e-Library does not only hold bibliographical information of publications, but also information about police-related research projects, either completed, ongoing or in planning. Furthermore, the e-Net offers an e-Journals service which provides registered users with access to international scientific journals related to police science, police practices, European issues, and special law enforcement perspectives.

The purpose of CEPOL's Common Curricula, also available on the e-Net, is to provide recommendations about law enforcement training on specific subjects with a European dimension. Member States can then use the recommendations within their national law enforcement training programmes according to their individual needs. Additionally, the Common Curricula provide the basic ideas and elements for CEPOL's courses and seminars.

CEPOL Exchange Programme (CEP) is a flagship activity, offering law enforcement officers from the EU and beyond the opportunity to spend one week with a counterpart in their country, exchanging knowledge and good practices, initiating cooperation projects and fostering deep and long-lasting learning and networking opportunities.

The CEPOL European Joint Master Programme (EJMP) is a very important learning programme in CEPOL's training portfolio. It is an EU academic programme, led by a Consortium of 21 partners and CEPOL, which is dedicated to the legal, strategic, and operational aspects of international and European police cooperation. The EJMP is addressed to senior law enforcement officers or experts in general management and specialist positions who intend to gain or improve competences in the field of international and European police and law enforcement management. Two modules of the second edition of the EJMP (2017-2019) are planned for 2019 with the graduation ceremony at CEPOL headquarters in October 2019.





CEPOL Exchange Programme

The CEP is an Erasmus-style exchange programme that allows law enforcement officers to spend one week with a counterpart in their country, exchanging knowledge and good practices, initiating cooperation projects and fostering deep and long-lasting learning and networking opportunities.

The programme seeks to enhance cooperation in combating crime. It is based on mobility, mutual learning and provides participants with an opportunity to familiarise themselves with working methods of other countries. Such exchanges promote trust and cooperation between law enforcement officers from across Europe and beyond.

The programme fulfils one of CEPOL's key objectives – developing a European law enforcement culture. It allows participants to spend a week (Monday – Friday) with a counterpart in a chosen hosting country.

The Exchange Programme is open to law enforcement officers from all EU Member States, EU Candidate Countries, Western Balkan and European Neighbourhood Policy Eastern Partnership countries. It is available for all law enforcement bodies.

In 2019, the programme has been further refined to better reflect requirements deriving from the EU Policy Cycle priorities as well as requests from Member States. Thematic areas of study are better synchronised with CEPOL's overall training portfolio, which enables the Exchange Programme to complement CEPOL's other training options, contributing to the agency's multi-layered approach to learning. The programme now also allows "pre-matched" participation where both exchangees give reference to each other in their applications ensuring full coherency with national priorities and requirements.

The programme has also been enhanced to encompass exchange opportunities related to border and coast guarding in close cooperation with Frontex.

The deadline for National Exchange Coordinators to nominate participants to take part in the 2019 Exchange Programme is set to 1st of March 2019. A similar exchange programme is planned to be implemented in 2020.

European Joint Master Programme

The CEPOL European Joint Master Programme (EJMP) is an EU academic programme which aims to address common challenges of police cooperation in the frame of internal security. It provides students with science-based competences in a European community of practice.

This master programme is unique and complementary to the Higher Education Programme and to existing master programmes on policing in the EU Member States. The programme fully complies with the Bologna Declaration for higher education and the Dublin Descriptors, which are recognised by all universities in the European Union. This alignment warrants the academic quality, coherence, and consistency of the European Joint Master Programme.

The European Joint Master Programme (EJMP) is a very important learning programme in CEPOL's portfolio, and is dedicated to the legal and operational aspects of international and European police cooperation. The academic programme is led by a Consortium of 21 partners and CEPOL. Accreditation has been provided by the Spanish accreditation institute ANECA and the master Diploma will be awarded by the Spanish University UNED.

The EJMP is addressed to senior law enforcement officers or experts in general management and specialist positions who intend to gain or improve competences in the field of international and European police and law enforcement management.

The language of the CEPOL European Joint Master Programme is English.

In the first European Joint Master Programme (2015-2017) 26 students graduated in 2017 and have received their Master Diploma.

In the second Master (2017-2019) 30 students have been enrolled to take part in 7 modules implemented by the following EU Member States:

- Module one: Budapest, Hungary from 9-13 October 2017;
- Module two: Tampere, Finland from 15-19 January 2018;
- Module three: Italy from 26-30 March 2018;
- Module four: Lithuania from 18-22 June 2018;
- Module five: Romania from 24-28 September 2018;
- Module six: Netherlands from 10-14 December 2018;
- Module seven (Thesis): Implemented online by Estonia 16 February 2 August 2019;
- Graduation: 11 October 2019 in Budapest.
