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Privacy Statement for Processing Input to Webinar Needs Analysis

Regulation (EC) 45/2001 applies to the processing of personal data carried out by CEPOL. Further to Article 11 and Article 12 of the Regulation, the CEPOL provides the Data Subjects with the following information:

In order to establish the list of webinars for the CEPOL Annual Single Programming Document an analysis of the needs for webinar topics is carried out (WNA). The objectives of this
analysis are threefold: Listing of webinars to be included on the Annual Webinar Calendar, in terms of aim, target audience, category and justification of the identified needs for the events; Identification of Member States' availability to organise webinars; Identification of webinar presenters from the Member States. To enable performing annual WNA, the set of personal data are collected from respondents.
In order to provide input to the WNA, the following personal data is requested from the CNUs, OCPs and relevant partners via LimeSurvey: Country Organisation Name Work email IP address (stored automatically)
The WNA is set as an open survey in the LimeSurvey. The LimeSurvey is an open source online survey application, which enables to collect responses, create statistics and export the resulting data to other applications. WNA is performed through following steps: [1] The link to access the survey is disseminated through CNUs and OCPs only. This link enables accessing the survey and providing with required information to the WNA. The survey is open for 3 – 4 weeks.
[2] Once the input is submitted, the survey is closed at LimeSurvey and raw data exported to a separate excel format file. Survey is deleted from the LimeSurvey server approximately 2 weeks later. Raw data are stored at CEPOL. [3] Submitted raw data are processed by dedicated CEPOL officer. Answers are anonymous in the final report.

Data Subjects are providing voluntarily their personal data
Personal data collected from respondents is stored for a maximum of n + 2 years to enable performing analysis of queries made. Personal data is not stored for longer periods than mentioned
