

DECISION 17/2008/GB
OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE EUROPEAN POLICE COLLEGE
**APPROVING THE APPOINTMENT OF ONE MEMBER
OF THE WORKING GROUP ON LEARNING
AND AMENDING DECISION 10/2007/GB
OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE EUROPEAN POLICE COLLEGE**

THE GOVERNING BOARD,

Having regard to Council Decision 2005/681/JHA of 20 September 2005 establishing the European Police College (CEPOL) ⁽¹⁾, and in particular Article 10(10) thereof;

Having regard to Decision 10/2007/GB of the Governing Board of the European Police College establishing Committees, Working Groups, Project Groups and Sub-groups and laying down rules governing the creation of Committees and Groups ⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 6 thereof;

Having regard to the proposal of the Training and Research Committee ⁽³⁾, submitted by Italy;

Whereas:

- (1) It is for the Governing Board on the basis of Decision 10/2007/GB to approve the appointment by Committees of members of Working Groups.
- (2) Darius WÓJCIK (Poland) has stepped down as member of the Working Group on Learning. Subsequently a call for nominating experts was launched and one expert was appointed member of the Working Groups on Learning by the Training and Research Committee.
- (3) It is appropriate the appointment of Maria Belén CREGO SANCHEZ (Spain) as member of the Working Group on Learning is approved.

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The Governing Board approve the appointment by the Training and Research Committee of Maria Belén CREGO SANCHEZ (Spain) as member of the Working Group on Learning.

Purpose:

The WGL shall provide support and advise pro-actively and reactively to the Training and Research Committee regarding effective learning, learning methods, quality assurance including evaluation.

Objectives:

The WGL shall improve the educational environment and the didactic methods used within the CEPOL network.

Tasks:

The WGL shall, in particular

1. review and re-development the Q-13 document, including the Q13 seminar;
2. develop evaluation instruments;
3. develop CEPOL-specific courses on didactics for trainers and certification of trainers, based on the competency profile for trainers;
4. reflect the possibilities integrating the principles of the Bruges-Copenhagen;
5. analyse methods to be used when developing and implementing e-learning modules;
6. analyse and develop Post-course learning reinforcement.

Number of meetings:

The WGL shall have no more than four ordinary meetings per year.”
