OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE EUROPEAN POLICE COLLEGE

AMENDING DECISION 29/2008/GB

OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE EUROPEAN POLICE COLLEGE CONCERNING USER RIGHTS OF THE E-NET

Adopted by the Governing Board on 9 December 2009

THE GOVERNING BOARD,

Having regard to Council Decision 2005/681/JHA of 20 September 2005 establishing the European Police College (CEPOL) (1), and in particular Article 7(h) thereof;

Having regard to the opinion of the Training and Research Committee (2);

Having regard to the proposal by the Strategy Committee, submitted by the Swedish Presidency of the European Police College;

Whereas:

- (1) Decision 29/2008/GB of the Governing Board of the European Police College concerning the Administration of the e-Net (3) does not define who should be granted basic user rights. It is therefore up to the discretion of the National e-Net Managers who is granted basic user rights and who is rejected.
- (2) National e-Net Managers have expressed their wish for guidelines regarding granting and rejecting basic user rights (4).
- (3) Considering that CEPOL is established as an EU Agency, which functions as a network of national training institutes in the Member States whose tasks include the training of senior police officers ⁵, the e-Net should be as open, transparent and accountable as possible but should also secure police related content of a sensitive nature.
- (4) Basic user rights, which include access to the entire restricted area of CEPOL's website, general Discussion Forum, general Chat, e-Library and e-Learning tool should therefore only be given to police officers and other employees of police authorities and organisations of the Member States.

- (5) To facilitate CEPOL's cooperation with universities and other research institutes, the e-Library of CEPOL's e-Net should be open to experts from outside police authorities and organisations.
- (6) It should be clarified that special user roles include basic user rights, notwithstanding the eligibility criteria for being granted basic user rights.
- (7) In order to apply the same standards in any participating Member State it is desirable to amend Decision 29/2008/GB of the Governing Board of the European Police College and to adopt the following decision.

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1 Amendments

Article 6 of Decision 29/2007/GB of the Governing Board of the European Police College is replaced by the following:

"Article 6 User Rights and User Roles

- 1. The rights and roles as referred to in Article 4(2) of this Decision shall be <u>basic</u> user rights, <u>academic</u> user rights and <u>special</u> user roles.
- 2. Granting rights and roles shall require prior registration of the user.
- 3. Basic user rights shall
 - (a) be granted to police officers and employees of police authorities and organisations;
 - (b) allow access to the restricted area of CEPOL's website, general Discussion Forum, general Chat, e-Library and e-Learning tool.
- 4. Academic user rights shall

- (a) be granted to persons not eligible for basic user rights;
- (b) allow access to the e-Library.
- 5. Special user roles, which, notwithstanding the criteria as laid down in subparagraph 3(a) of this article, shall include basic user rights, shall be
 - (a) Member of the Governing Board, a Committee, Working Group, Project Group, Sub-group;
 - (b) Moderator of closed forum and chat;
 - (c) Participant in CEPOL activities, trainers and experts as well as other roles related to the e-Learning tool."
 - (d) Submitter, Moderator, Authority for collections within the e-Library.

Article 2 Entry into force

This decision shall take effect on the day following that of its adoption.
